When planning a trip, meeting or event it can be advantageous to focus or avoid holidays. Please see below for a list of Holidays that may be beneficial to consider.

Global/Cultural	January 1	New Year's Day
Regional: USA	January 20*	Inauguration Day
Regional: USA	3rd Monday in January	Martin Luther King Jr. Day
Cultural	Varies, between January 21 & February 20	Lunar New Year
Regional: USA	3rd Monday in February	George Washington's Birthday
Cultural	February 14th	Valentine's Day
Regional	2nd Sunday in March	Daylight Saving Time
Regional: Canada	Friday before Easter	Good Friday
Religious	Varies, often end of March or beginning April	Passover/Easter
Regional: USA	April 15**	Tax Day
Regional: Canada	Monday preceding May 25th	Victoria Day
Regional: USA	Last Monday in May	Memorial Day
Regional: Canada	July 1st***	Canada Day
Regional: USA	July 4	Independence Day
Regional: USA + Canada	1st Monday in September	Labor Day
Religious: Jewish	Varies, usually in September	Rosh Hashanah
Religious: Jewish	Varies, usually in September of October	Yom Kippur
Regional: USA	2nd Monday in October	Indigenous People's Day
Regional: Canada	2nd Monday in October	Thanksgiving Day
Regional	First Sunday in November	Daylight Saving Time Ends
Regional: USA	November 11	Veterans Day
Regional: Canada	November 11	Remembrance Day
Regional: USA	4th Thursday in November	Thanksgiving Day
Regional/Religious	December 25	Christmas Day

*Observed every four years. When January 20th falls on a Saturday, it is usually observed on the preceding Friday. When the date falls on a Sunday, it is usually observed on the following Monday.

**If April 15th falls on a Saturday, Sunday or holiday, the first succeeding day that is not a Saturday, Sunday or holiday is Tax day.

*** If July 1st is a Sunday, the holiday is observed on a Monday.
